Regular Meeting Minutes

Indian River Mosquito Control District March 9, 2021 @ 9:00 AM

The Indian River Mosquito Control District Board of Commissioners held a regular meeting on March 9, 2021 at the District Office. The meeting was also held virtually via Zoom.

- I. Call to Order Chair Broda called the meeting to order at 9:00 AM.
- II. Pledge of Allegiance
- III. Roll Call Chair Broda called roll and all three commissioners were present.

IV. Approval of Agenda

Chair Broda requested a motion to approve the agenda. Commissioner Lowther made the motion to approve the agenda. Commissioner Erpenbeck seconded the motion. The Board unanimously approved; motion passed.

Chair Broda asked for motion for approval of consent agenda. Commissioner Lowther made motion to approve the consent agenda. Commissioner Erpenbeck seconded the motion. The Board unanimously approved; motion passed.

VI. Public Comment

Jeff Andros asked about the hiring of a previous employee, requesting who it was, when they start and how much they will be paid. He also inquired if the Commissioners use personal emails to conduct official business and stated he was still waiting on public records requests to be fulfilled and responses from Commissioner Broda and Commissioner Erpenbeck to his written or verbal questions of them.

Frank Clarke stated he and his staff are available if there are any questions with regards to the aerial bids.

VII. Old Business

A. Audit Report

Christine, CRI provided an overview of the draft audit report. Chair Broda asked for motion for approval of audit report. Commissioner Broda identified a clerical error on the cover sheet that will be corrected for final draft. **Commissioner Lowther made motion to approve the audit report.**

- Legislative Action (State) House Bill 1103 & Senate Bill 1624 These bills relate to special district
 accountability, requiring "performance audits" of fire, hospital, mosquito control and soil and water
 conservation districts and requiring new financial reporting requirements for all special districts. The
 audits for mosquito control and soil and water are to be performed by the Office of Program Policy
 Analysis and Government Accountability (OPPAGA) by September 30, 2023.
- Legislative Action (Federal) Staff will be sending requests to the Congressman and both Senators
 for their consideration of submitting a funding request to the Appropriations Subcommittee for the
 Mosquito-Borne Diseases activities authorized by the Strengthening Mosquito Abatement for Safety
 and Health (SMASH) act. This funding would enable local Districts to protect the public health in our
 community from mosquito-borne diseases such as Zika and West Nile virus.
- Operational Report –Dave provided a update on operational activities. February rainfall amounts were above average resulting in an increase in mosquitoes and treatments. Impoundment staff working on maintenance activities and electrical work on the Estuary (Sand Pointe) and Vista Royale. Seven aerial missions, totaling 3,370 acres, were completed because of rainfall. Total rainfall was 3.0 inches with maximum tide of 22 inches. Adulticide (ULV) received 19 service requests and treated 422 miles. Staff has provided increased surveillance and treatments as needed at the Fairgrounds as it is a location for citizens to receive COVID vaccinations. No statewide or local sentinel activity this past month. New sentinel chickens scheduled to arrive next month.
